CONSTITUTION OF INDIA.

No. SCT. 6572/3003(207)/TE-2(B).—In exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to article 309 of the Constitution of India and in supersession of all existing rules, orders or instruments made in this behalf, the Governor of Maharashtra is hereby pleased to make the following rules regulating recruitment to the post of Head Master, Government Technical High School, in the Maharashtra Educational Service, Class-I (Junior) namely :-

- 1. (i) These rules may be called the Head Master, Government Technical High School, in the Maharashtra Educational Service. Class-I (Junior) (Recruitment) Rules, 1989.
- (ii) These rules shall be deemed to have come into force with effect from the 11th day of February 1977.
 - 2. In these rules, unless the context requires otherwise,-
 - (a) "Commission" means the Maharashtra Public Service Commission;
 - (b) "Degree" means a degree of a statutory University;
 - (c) "Diploma" means a diploma awarded by the Board of Technical Examinations, Maharashtra State, or by the Institution recognised by the Government or its equivalent;
 - (d) "Government" means the Government of Maharashtra.
- 3. Appointment to the post of Head Master, Government Technical High School, in the Maharashtra Educational Service, Class-! (Junior),
 - (a) by promotion of a suitable person on the basis of seniority subject to fitness from amongst the persons holding the posts from the cadre of Maharashtra Educational Service, Class-II, having not less than three years continuous service in that cadre in the Mechanical or Electrical Engineering Groups and possessing the qualifications and experience prescribed for appointment by nomination in clause (b); or
 - (b) by nomination from amongst candidates who,-
 - (i) unless already in the service of the Government are not more than thirty five years of age;
 - (ii) possess a Bachelor's degree in Mechanical or Electrical Engineering or in both at least in Second Class or a Master's degree in Mechanical or Electrical Engineering or in both; or
 - (iii) possess a diploma in Mechanical or Electrical Engineering or in both at least in second class and have passed sections A and B of the Associate Membership Examination of the Institution of Engineers (India); and

- 7. A person appointed to the posts, whether by promotion or by nonunation shall be required to pass the Departmental Examination, and examinations in Hindr and Mara hi according to the rules made in that behalf, unless he has already passed, or has been exempted from passing those examinations.
- 8. A person appointed to the post shall be fiable for transfer anywhere in the state of Maharashtra.
- 9. Notwithstanding anything contained in rule 5, if in he opinion of the Government the exigencies of service so require, Government may, after consultation with the Commission, wherever necessary, make appointments to the pasts of Head Master. Government Technical High School, in relaxation of the percentage prescribed in these rules for recruitment by Denny alion

CHEST TUTTON OF INDIA.

of all existing rules, orders or instruments made in this behalf, the Governor of Maharashtra is hereby pleased to make the following rules regulating recognitment to the post of Engineering Superintendent, Government Technical High School, it the Maharashtra Educational Service, Class I (Junior), namely:

- 1. (i) These rules may be called the Engineering Superintendent, Government Technical High School, in the Maharashtra Educational Service, Class I (Junior) (Recruitment) Rules, 1989.
- (ii) These rules shall be deemed to have come into force with effect from the 11th day of February, 1977.
 - 2. In these rules, unless the context requires otherwise,
 - (a) "Commission" means the Maharashtra Public Service Commission:
 - (b) "Degree" means a degree of a statutory University:
 - (c) "Diploma" means a diploma awarded by the Board of Technical Examinations, Maharashtra State, or by the Institution recognised by the Government or its equivalent;
 - (d) "Government" means the Government of Maharashira.

- (iv) have professional experience in a responsible position or experience of teaching the subject in any recognised Technical Institute or combined Professional, teaching and research experience for not less than three years, gained after acquiring the basic academic qualification mentioned in sub-clauses (ii) or (iii); or
- (v) possess a diploma in Mechanical or Electrical Engineering or in both at least in Second Class with Seven years' experience as mentioned in sub-clause $(i\nu)$;

Provided that,-

- (i) in the case of candidates having Master's degree the period of not more than two years, spent in acquiring the said degree, and in the case of those who have completed a course of the Technical Teachers' Training under a scheme of the Government or of the Government of India, the period spent in completing the course, in no case exceeding two years, shall be counted towards the prescribed period of experience;
- (ii) any requirements in respect of the qualifications may be relaxed in favour of candidates who have done original research work of outstanding merit;
- (iii) if the candidates having experience for the prescribed period are not available in sufficient number, then those having experience of a shorter period may also be considered;
- (iv) the age limit may be relaxed by Governmen, on the recommendation of the Commission in favour of candidates possessing exceptional qualifications or experience or both;
 - (v) preference may be given to candidate who,
 - (a) possess a Master's degree in Engineering; or
 - (b) have research experience; or
 - (c) have teaching experience under the Craftsman Training Schemes; or
 - (d) are members of a professional Institute.
- 4. Notwithstanding anything contained in sub-clauses (ii), (iii), (iv) and (v) of clause (b) of rule (3), if at any stage of selection, the Commission is of the opinion that sufficient number of candidates possessing the requisite higher basic academic qualifications or experience are not available to fill up the vacancies reserved for candidates belonging to the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Castes converts to Buddhism, Scheduled Tribes, Denotified Tribes or Normadic Tribes, then the Commission may, in the case of such selection, relax the requirement in respect of the class in the degree or diploma or the period of experience or both, set out therein, and select suitable candidates belonging to such Castes or Tribes.
- 5. Appointments to the posts by promotion and by nomination shall be made in the ratio of 50: 50.
- 6. A person appointed to the post by nomination shall be on probation for a period of two years.
